Prof Sibal helped set up the first successful liver transplant program in India in 1998 at Apollo Hospitals, Delhi. In 2012, 1200 solid organ transplants in children and adults (840 kidney and 360 liver) were performed. The Apollo Transplant Program thus became the first transplant program in the world to perform more than 1000 transplants in a year and Apollo Delhi the busiest transplant centre in the world by performing 813 transplants (269 liver, 544 kidney). The Apollo Transplant Program remained the busiest program in the world in 2013 by performing 1456 transplants (390 liver, 10566 kidney) and Apollo Delhi the busiest centre with 952 transplants (283 liver, 669 kidney). The year 2014 saw continuing growth of the program with 1547 (422 Liver and 1125 Kidney) transplants being conducted across the Group, with Delhi performing 1065 (304 Liver and 761 Kidney) transplants. Thus, Apollo Delhi continued to remain the busiest solid organ transplant centre in the world for the 3rd consecutive year.

In June 2005, he helped achieve the First International Accreditation of a hospital in India by Joint Commission International (JCI). Eight Apollo Hospitals are accredited by JCI. Prof. Sibal served as the only Asian JCI Physician Surveyor from January 2008 to 2010. He currently is a member of the Regional Middle East International Advisory Board of JCI.

Prof. Sibal was appointed as the Group Medical Director of the Apollo Hospitals Group in 2005. Apollo Hospitals Group is the largest integrated healthcare corporation in Asia. Starting with a 150-bedded hospital in Chennai, today the Apollo Group owns and manages over 9000 hospital beds across 54 hospitals in three countries. The Group has treated 39 million patients from 120 countries performing the most complex of surgeries at a success rate comparable to the best in the West. The Apollo Group provides a seamless healthcare delivery system encompassing tertiary, secondary and primary care. In addition, the Group has a strong presence in allied fields such as hospital project consultancy, healthcare IT and internet based technology, telemedicine, education and training, home healthcare, pharmacy retailing and medical business process outsourcing.

Prof. Sibal was appointed as an Adjunct Professor of Pediatrics, School of Medicine, University of Queensland, Brisbane, Australia in June 2009. In October 2009, he was appointed as the member of the Institute Body of the Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, (PGIMER) Chandigarh. PGIMER has been consistently rated among the top 3 academic medical centres in India.

Prof Sibal is on the Editorial Board of 3 Journals and has 85 publications. He has served on the Executive Council of the International Pediatric Transplant Association, The Asian Pan Pacific Association of Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition and the Commonwealth Association of Pediatric Gastroenterology and Nutrition and has lectured extensively in India and abroad.
